

Prof. Nuria González has been elected the new Rector of Universidad de León

Professor of Business Organisation, Nuria González has been affiliated with the University of León for nearly 25 years and has served as the Vice Rector of Academic Affairs for the past four years. On the 9th of May 2024, she was elected as the university's first female rector.

Nuria González secured her election as rector by the university community, competing against law professors Juan José Fernández and Teresa Mata. She received 56.83% of the weighted vote, making her the top choice among students as well as teaching and research staff. On May 20, she succeeded García Marín as the head of the University of León, becoming the first woman to lead the rectorate for the next six years.

Prof. González has been affiliated with the University of León for nearly 25 years, dedicating her career to teaching and research in the field of business organisation, where she serves as a professor. She also worked at the Doctoral School as its secretary before joining the team of the current rector, Juan Francisco García Marín, in 2020 as the Vice Rector of Academic Affairs. She held this position until the start of the 2024 election campaign.

In an interview with a local newspaper, she expressed feeling "very encouraged and supported" to present a project for the next six years that is "representative of the diverse facets of the ULE" and backed by a "solid, established, renewed, and experienced" team.
